Collaborating with a university can mean working with the most advanced technical thinking, the latest technology and novel experimental techniques to help bring a concept to market.

This booklet provides the information you need to decide whether your business might benefit from engaging with a University, and provides the contacts for you to further explore the opportunities available through industry-researcher collaboration.

What is R&D?

Research and development (R&D) refers to the activities companies undertake to innovate and introduce new products and services.

Research is uncertain. There is an element of unpredictability with all research, which means that research can be risky. Conversely, research breakthroughs are often ground breaking for business growth and transformational for entire industries.

When should I consider collaborating with a university?

- When you have identified a problem in your industry where no "off the shelf" solution currently exists
- If you need scientific lab equipment to verify your technology
- If you are looking to set up a talent pipeline for your business
- When you are looking to access a new market
- When your problem needs a multidisciplinary solution

What benefits can it provide my business?

- Access to cutting-edge specialist expertise without needing to have a full range of specialist skills in-house
- Reduced costs in commercialising new ideas and products by sharing costs with partner organisations (including tax benefits)
- · Cutting the time it takes to bring innovations to market
- A stream of new ideas for further development
- Sharing technical and commercial risks
- · Access to fresh perspectives on potential viability or commercial potential before incurring development costs
- · Access to new graduate talent in your operation's specialisation

COLLABORATE TO INNOVATE

Collaborate to Innovate is administered by the Entrepreneurs' Programme and Austmine. This program is designed to support SMEs in the energy and resources sector to take the first step in a collaborative relationship with a research institution. Depending on specific business requirements, this program may include:

- Sign up of eligible companies to receive Business Capability Development services.
- **One-on-one gap analysis** with an experienced Business Advisor using specifically designed diagnostic tools that address SME capability and performance.
- **Development of a tailored plan** for each participating company, which provides an assessment of performance gaps and recommended actions.
- Access to a Business Advisor and NIER Research and Development Coordinator for support and mentoring over a 12 month period.
- Access to resources and learning events relevant to business development.
- **Financial assistance** for companies to engage expert external knowledge and advice if required (up to \$20K on a \$ for \$ basis)
- An opportunity to co-locate your business at the Innovation Launchpad, hosted by the Newcastle Institute for Energy and Resources, to test, pilot and demonstrate new technologies
